Work paths need to be planned well so that people don't get in each other's way in the kitchen. The three zones used for refrigerating/storing food, cooking and dishwashing should not be much more than two arm lengths apart – and still provide enough space for several cooks. Important utensils are best kept near the hob, food close to the area in which it is prepared.
